Additional Housing Resources

If your household needs additional housing assistance, please follow the links below to connect with these resources. *Updated 9/26/2022*

Kansas Homeowner Assistance Fund (KHAF): Eligible Kansas households impacted by the pandemic can apply for financial assistance with mortgages, property taxes, homeowners' insurance, and energy costs.

Rental Housing Resources: Access a list of KHRC's affordable properties, search the HUD Resource Locator, or file a tenant complaint.

Kansas Community Action Agencies: These agencies aim to reduce poverty, revitalize low-income communities, and empower low-income families and individuals to become fully self-sufficient. Find the agency that serves your county using these two resources:: regional service areas map and list of CAA agencies.

<u>Emergency Service Providers</u>: If you or your family are experiencing homelessness or domestic violence, find your nearest shelter and service provider from this list or access <u>HUD's Find Shelter tool</u>..

Tenant Based Rental Assistance (TBRA): Find your county's grantee from the list at the bottom of the page to learn about eligibility guidelines and apply for assistance with rent payments, security deposits, and/or utility deposits.

<u>United Way 2-1-1 of Kansas</u>: Use this directory, or dial 211 on your cellphone, to find local resources in your area that address hunger, utility assistance, housing concerns, and more.

<u>Kansas Emergency Water Assistance Program (EWAP)</u>: Find out if your household qualifies and apply to have your water service restored or prevented from disconnection.

<u>Low-Income Energy Assistance Program (LIEAP)</u>: Find out if your household qualifies and apply for financial assistance with home energy costs.

Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP): Federal Communications Commission (FCC) program that pays \$30 month for internet access for low-income families and \$100 towards devices to access the internet.

<u>HUD Housing Counseling Agencies</u>: Certified housing counselors can discuss options if you're having trouble paying your mortgage or managing your reverse mortgage. Or search <u>HUD's official list of housing counselors</u>.

<u>Weatherization Assistance Program</u>: Income-eligible homeowners and renters can apply through their region's provider to receive weatherization services and lower utility bills.

<u>Tenant/Landlord Education</u>: If you feel you've been discriminated against, connect with organizations that help to ensure fair housing practices, including <u>Kansas Legal Services</u>.
